#### New Fire and Police Station well underway

Prescot's new co- located Fire and Police Station appears to be well under way. The new building will replace the existing fire stations at Huyton and Whiston. Whilst the new building, primarily a Fire Station will also have some dedicated area for neighborhood policing and community accessible rooms. Built on part of the site of the former BICC factory on Manchester Road / Hall Lane the station is a valuable addition to Prescot's infrastructure and a good use of

formerly derelict brownfield site.

The new building is scheduled to be completed around February 2018, the existing fire stations at Huyton and Whiston will continue to operate until the new station is open.

## Sun Shines Bright on Prescot Carnival 2017

In contrast to last year, both the Prescot Carnival and the Mayor of Prescot's Parade were blessed with beautiful weather, which really helped to make this year's events a huge success.

The Carnival was officially opened by the Mayor of Prescot Cllr Jennifer Chadwick following the arrival of the Mayor's Parade at the Carnival at 12pm.

Over 5000 visitors to the Carnival were treated to a variety of performances including Pemberton Old Wigan DW Band (who led the Parade), H& M Dog Display Team, Starlight Morris Dancers and M & H Gymnastics. The Town Council also provided a range of other free attractions including a rodeo bull, inflatable maze, bungee run and bouncy castle, along with opportunities to get up close and personal with various creepy crawlies from Reefs Reptiles and fabulous examples of birds of prey from S&R Birds.



Council members, staff and volunteers were on hand to cook and serve on the Town Council's food stall, prices were kept low to ensure affordability for local families. In addition to the Town Council's food stall over 25 other independent traders offered a wide variety of goods and services to those in attendance, those seeking extra excitement were well catered for by Silcocks fun fair and those in need of a more sedate experience being catered for with the ever popular donkey rides provided by Hollyfold Donkey Hire. The Town Council would also like to thank 1438 (Prescot) Squadron RAF Air Cadets who supported the Staff, council members, and volunteers with the set up and take down of the event.
