#### New Picnic Bench at Eaton Street Park

Clearly replacing the benches like for would only see us repeating the process time after time and at a cost of roughly £500 each would not be sustainable. Therefore in an effort to address the situation a heavy and robust concrete bench has now been purchased. Time will tell how effective this remedy is, but this could be the way forward for our park furniture.
