Mayor of Prescot's Charity Christmas Concert

On Thursday 8th December 2016 420 people were welcomed into Prescot Parish Church for the annual Mayor of Prescot's Charity Christmas concert. St Mary & St Paul's Primary School Year 3 Choir, Knowsley Ladies Choir, Evelyn Community Primary School and Staff Choirs, Prescot Parish Church Choir, and Brassworks Quintet, all delighted the audience with their musical contributions. Three congregational carols ensured that the audience also played their part in the festive celebration. The evening concluded with mince pies and shortbread, but not before Prescot Festival's Artistic Director, Dr Robert Howard, was awarded an Exceptional Service Award by Revd. Canon John Taylor on behalf of the British Arts Festival Association. This was in recognition of his exceptional and innovative work in founding the Prescot Festival, and sustaining it for over ten years. The concert raised £1112.45 for the Mayor of Prescot's Charities.

Brown's Field Park Developments

In order to progress the Brown's Field master plan, the Town Council have recently commissioned a package of site investigation works. Brown's Field is a very old site, and has had a number of other functions in the past, before being used as a public open space, these included an allotment and water treatment works. Therefore it is a requirement under planning legislation to carry out appropriate investigation works to ensure the site is suitable for the proposed developments i.e. drainage schemes for the football pitches, extended footpaths etc. Once the investigation is completed the results will inform a planning application.



Prescot Hockey Club
