Browns Field

As many local residents will be aware, Knowsley Metropolitan Borough Council have recently announced that they would like to sell off Browns Field (aka King George V Memorial Playing Fields Prescot) for housing development. The proceeds of any such sale being used to create an endowment fund, the interest from which would be used to meet the costs of parks maintenance across Knowsley through the formation of a trust.

On the 13th November 2014 Prescot Town Council formally relayed its objection to the release of Greenbelt Land in Prescot to Knowsley Council. This is a position the Town Council still holds, and the realise of greenspaces raises great concerns. The Town Council currently hold a lease on Browns Field which is not due to expire until 2090, therefore KMBC cannot sell the land without consent from the Town Council or the legal dissolving of the lease through the courts.

The Town Council cares passionately about the maintenance and quality of parks and green spaces in the Town, which it considers to be a vital contributor to quality of life, health and well — being. We also fully appreciate the need for Knowsley MBC to look for creative solutions to respond to the very challenging funding environment it is faced with.

The Town Council is committed to a collaborative relationship with KMBC, a future Parks Trust and any other body that can make a positive contribution to the quality of life of Prescot residents, and will now meet with representatives from KMBC in the coming weeks to fully understand their proposal before agreeing its position on the matter.



New Developments for Prescot

A recent planning committee meeting at Knowsley Council agreed the long awaited final designs and application for the New Shakespeare North Theatre which will sit at the heart of the Town. The modified design now includes a dedicated Exhibition and Education Centre, the design of the external glazing façade has been refreshed and the building will no longer

include a basement.

The main contractor will be appointed in December and preconstruction work will start from February 2018 with all construction expected to be completed by April 2020. The first Masters students are expected to start their studies in October 2020.



At the same meeting approval was granted for 119 new homes on the former BICC site and a new Shakespeare themed hotel. The new homes will form parcel E of the master plan for the site.

Whilst proposals for the new hotel include a 27 bed hotel, set across five floors, along with a restaurant, bar, function rooms and





car park. The hotel will be on the site of the old Imperial Hotel pub on Bridge Road opposite Prescot Railway Station, which is also set for some major improvement works.
