#### **Halloween Events**

Both the Town's parks have been seen extremely successful Halloween events this year. The friends groups at both Eaton Street and Brown's Field have provided events catering for some 700 residents. Brown's Field used and decorated Carr Lane Woods as a venue for a 'spooky walk' that saw around 300 residents of all ages take part in the darkness of Sunday evening. Whilst Friends of Eaton Street park linked in with Knowsley Snap to provide a Halloween Family Fun Activity & Lunch & LITTLE SCAMPS!

Both events were entirely free of charge! to the public

#### Wheelie Bin Fire on Eaton Street Park

Disappointingly there has been an arson incident on Eaton Street Park. The incident took place on Sunday Evening. Fortunately, there was no damage to the infrastructure in the park and the resulting debris was promptly removed. I have contacted Prescot Cables to ask for CCTV footage of the incident, which I will then forward to Knowsley's crime and disorder reduction partnership.

#### New additions to the Town Centre

As anyone living in Prescot will be aware there are lots of new businesses springing all over the Town. The majority of which are providing new leisure offers within the Town Centre, the latest of these to open has been Harrington's Bar and Eatery at 77 Eccleston Street, which opened on Friday 18<sup>th</sup> October and Al's Place which was opened by the Mayor on the 28<sup>th</sup> October.

Next up will be Domino's which will occupy 18 High Street and will also be opened by the Mayor on the 11<sup>th</sup> November at 2:00pm. Imaginarium Bistro will open on the 29<sup>th</sup> November 2019 and will be supported by an Ice Rink provided by KMBC for weekend.



There are also plans to open an new Gin Bar at 53 Eccleston Street and the iconic Flat Iron building at the top of Eccleston Street is also well under development with support from KMBC's Historic England's Heritage Action Zone initiative, whilst plans to deliver a new restaurant and bar at the opposite end of Eccleston Street have also been submitted for the old HSBC bank building.

#### Christmas Events

As usual Prescot Town Centre is set to be busy in the run up to and over the Christmas period, known events at this time include:-

Christmas is set to begin a bit earlier than usual as on 16<sup>th</sup> November – KMBC and Prescot Business Club will be organising a Christmas Light switch on event on the 16<sup>th</sup> November. Sadly this is the first time in 5 years the Town Council will not be organising the event, as members are aware the Town Council have chosen not to partake in the event on the grounds of value for money, and will instead organise its own event on 14<sup>th</sup> December.

As mentioned, the Imaginarium Bistro opening is on the 29<sup>th</sup> November and will have a bit of a Christmas feel with the ice rink.

KMBC will be providing an additional event on the 14<sup>th</sup> December with Live Reindeers on Eccleston Street

However, the Town Council's – Christmas Cracker Event, also on the 14<sup>th</sup> December is set to be the biggest Event the Town Council has ever provided. With KMBC having completely taken over the Christmas Lights the Town Council's Events committee has found itself with additional budget to put into a Christmas Event.

This years event will now include

- Rodeo Rudolf
- Snow board simulator
- Walkabout reindeer characters
- Selection pack give away
- Live performances including local artists, dance groups and school choirs
- Children's Fair Ground Ride
- Free refreshments
- Best Dressed Elf competition
- Various Community Stalls

Best of all is that these attractions are completely free of charge.
