As mentioned earlier on the Town Council were deeply saddened by the news that Knowsley Council plan to sell off Brown's Field to partially fund its new Green Space Trust. Like all councils across the country and particularly in our region Knowsley Council are facing funding cuts that mean it is difficult for them to continue to pay for 'Non statutory services' such as parks maintenance. Prescot however differs from other parts of Knowsley as the two formal parks in Prescot namely Brown's Field (KGV Prescot) and Eaton Street Park are maintained by the Town Council, therefore Knowsley Council have very little maintenance responsibility or costs when it comes to Prescot parks. This fact makes it particularly hard to understand Knowsley's logic as they are proposing to be sell off a piece of land in Prescot that they do not maintain so that they can use the money



Particularly when you consider that Knowsley themselves give Brown's Field 'top marks' when it comes to community value and usage. As you will be aware Brown's Field is extremely well used by the community, with the Town Council holding its annual Carnival on this site, a tradition which dates back 26 years to 1992. The loss of such a greenspace would be hugely detrimental, particularly at a time when the Town's population is set to rise with the addition of 750 new homes a couple of hundred yards away on the former BICC site at the bottom of Carr Lane.

The Town Council have worked with local residents to explore an alternative to the sale of its valued parkland, including options to protect those sites with the highest community value over those with the lowest. These proposals can be seen on our website in the News and Events section, the Town Council would like to pay special thanks to Mr Chris Marsh who's support to the Town Council in this process has been invaluable.

The Town Council believes strongly that Public Open Space is very important to the health and wellbeing of the Township and helps to make Prescot an attractive place to live. Therefore, the Town Council seeks to make the most of its public open space by constantly looking at ways to develop the spaces for the benefit of our residents. Since 2014 the Town Council has invested £14,000 in propriety works needed to support a detailed planning application to deliver the Brown's Field master plan. It has recently been brought to the Town Council's attention that Brown's Field has played a significant role in Women's Football as arguably the most influential player in the development game, Sylvia Gore learnt her





trade on Brown's Field. Sylvia's story is truly inspirational having fought through discrimination barriers just to be allowed to play alongside the boys whom she quickly showed she could out play. Sylvia's involvement at Brown's Field could be the catalyst we have been looking for, that would help us to realise the Master Plan while also providing an opportunity to celebrate and remember a Prescotian who made an impact at an international level.

Since Knowsley's announcement was made members of the local community have reacted to oppose Knowsley's plans and in doing so have formed the Friends of KGV Brown's Field and Carr Lane Woods, @SaveKGVPrescot this group meets on site each Saturday at 10:30 to carry out activities that improve the park such as litter picks, they would welcome any new members. The group worked tirelessly and have collected close to 1,600 signatures to support the retention of the park in its entirety, they have also linked up with Berkley Juniors AFC who play their games on Brown's Field



What's going on at Eaton Street Park

Eaton Street Park is the other one of the Town's parks to be maintained by the Town Council. Located on Eaton Street next to Prescot Cables, Eaton Street is one of two public open spaces in the town to hold a prestigious 'Green Flag Award' with the other being Prescot Cemetery and Churchyard.

Eaton Street Park provides an excellent visitor offer with two playgrounds catering for all ages up to 13, a considerable wildflower and natural habitat together with formal crown green bowling area and pavilion building. Keys to the bowling green are available for hire from the Town Hall at £10 per year, the resident bowling club (Prescot Ladies) play on a Tuesday evening and as such have priority at that time. The group are active on the site providing a weekly tea and coffee afternoon each Sunday 2pm to 4pm in the pavilion. The group have really grown in strength since their creation in 2011 and particularly since the Town Council worked with them and Knowsley Council to attract external funding to deliver a new pavilion building to the site in 2016.

The new building has helped the group expand their activities on site to include a range of annual events including the Party in Park (summer) and hosting Father Christmas Grotto in December, the proceeds from these events are then reinvested back into the park, the most recent example of which was three vandal resistant benches, which were deemed prudent following a spate of arson last summer, which saw three picnic benches destroyed.
